Now they had landed at their destination in the country of the Gadarenes. There they found two men possessed with devils. These devils were the ones speaking in the passage above. They knew that a future time had been appointed for them to enter their eternal doom. They and their master, Satan, would be cast into the lake of fire (Matthew 25:41). They apparently feared that this powerful man, Jesus, the Son of God, might send them there early.
