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This was about as politically incorrect as one could get. Jesus was undermining the lies and extortionary practices of these powerful rulers.

Men have changed little from that day to this. Faith in the sacrificial death of Christ as the only way to be saved, is still politically incorrect.

Have you been washed in the blood of Christ? Or are you a slave to the political correctness of powerful leaders?

## POLITICALLY INCORRECT

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Power hungry officials often establish systems of political correctness and censorship to maintain wealth and power over the people. The Jewish leaders of Jesus' day did this. They couldn't deny that Jesus' miracles fulfilled ancient prophecies proving Him to be the long awaited Messiah. However, they valued political power more than saving truth. They called an emergency meeting to decide what to do.

"Then gathered the chief priests and the Pharisees a council, and said, What do we? for this man doeth many miracles. If we let him thus alone, all men will believe on him: and the Romans shall come and take away both our place and nation." (John 11:47-48)

Though many Jewish leaders believed Jesus was the Messiah, they were afraid to express this publicly.

They were defiling the holy purposes of this special place by repurposing it as a place to acquire wealth by selling animals for sacrifice. Jesus made a whip and drove them out!

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
