Their throat is an open sepulchre; with their tongues they have used deceit; the poison of asps is under their lips:" (Romans 3:10-13)

I once asked a lady where she thought she would go after she died. Her response was similar to Ssssam's. She replied, "God will take me to Heaven. I've lived a pretty good life. I go to church. He knows my good deeds outweigh my bad ones. Overall, I'm a pretty nice person."
