There's a story of a boy who wanted to walk on water. He'd heard that, given enough faith, he could do anything. One day, as he walked to a nearby swimming hole with his friends, he decided to prove his faith. Running toward the water he repeatedly shouted, "I can walk on water!" He surfaced sputtering and, after catching his breath, said, dejectedly, "I knew it wouldn't work!"

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matters. He approached Jesus and said,

"Rabbi, we know that thou art a teacher come from God: for no man can do these miracles that thou doest, except God be with him" (John 3:2).

Today, some would immediately urge Nicodemus to pray "the sinner's prayer." Jesus didn't. Instead He said,

"Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God" (John 3:3).

Responding to subsequent questions by Nicodemus, Jesus emphasized that only the Holy Spirit, who moves as invisibly as the wind, can make alive the heart of man. He said,

"The wind bloweth where it listeth, and thou hearest the sound thereof, but canst not tell whence it cometh, and whither it goeth: so is every one that is born of the Spirit" (John 3:8).

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
